raising event for Blazing Hope Ranch, a budding ministry in Dayton, TN that exists to assist female survivors of human trafficking by providing healing, opportunity, protection, and education. Programs include transitional living, equestrian therapy, and camps for foster children.

The guest speaker, Angie Duncan, a survivor of human trafficking and founder of Hosea's Heart in Knoxville, TN opened my eyes to the need for places like Blazing Hope Ranch. The entire room leaned in to hear her heart-rending experience. The pain of her story was palpable. Tears pricked my eyes, but didn't start to fall until **she shared the hope she found in Jesus. That was beauty at its finest.**

I've heard reports of human trafficking on the news. Those stories evoke images in my mind from the movie Taken—white, middle-upper class girl, followed and kidnapped.

The truth behind the driving force of human trafficking is darker, and far more subtle. Who are the victims of human trafficking? Foster children on the fringe, desperate for a better life. Children sold by their own families for drug money. Young women raised under generational sex slavery, watching their mothers and grandmothers sell themselves to survive. The young woman at the strip club or exhibited in pornography might be there of her own volition, or she might be a victim of sexual slavery. The victims are the people society forgets.



The need is greater than we can imagine for places like Blazing Hope Ranch. But there is always hope. Those who society overlooks, God sees.

His heart is bent toward them and his hope rises...even from bandana ashes.

WHERE HOPE RUNS FREE

BORN TO FLY @ CAMP RUN FREE

“People don’t realize the pain and lack of self-worth in those of us who are victimized.” says Katarina Rosenblatt in her book “Stolen” **Children with low self-esteem are looking for love and someone to tell them they are good at something, worth caring about, and have valuable things to say.** These people, often children, are so desperate for someone to care that they are not aware of the danger until it is too late.

On the other side, **trafficker’s prowl like roaring lions looking for those that seem insecure and lonely.** People

that can be easily sold a lie. One pimp, when interviewed said, “tell a girl you’ll give her heaven and she’ll follow you into hell.” Traffickers are good at identifying the vulnerable and determining the best way to “hook” them.

“Until something changes inside us, we’re vulnerable and able to be manipulated by people who want to use our bodies for their gain.” Rosenblatt says. **This is why Blazing Hope Ranch has developed a day camp called Camp Run Free.** Every activity is based on an anti-child trafficking curriculum

called Born to Fly. This exciting new program will offer crafts, Bible teaching, games, horse activities, and a lesson. **Campers will have fun while also learning they were uniquely created with beautiful purpose,** build confidence and benefit from therapeutic work with hors-

es. They will learn to be patient as they are developing and building skills necessary for successful adulthood. They will learn to identify “dream thieves” and other risks to their future success.
